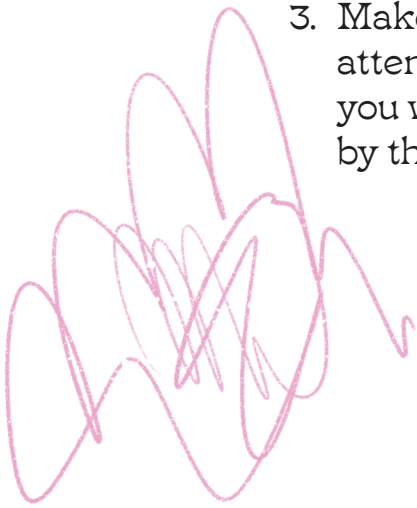


# CREATIVE PROMPT

## "Movie Draw-Along"

*Film is an incredible visual artform and can be a great resource for inspiration.*

1. Pick a movie; you can choose one that you love or one you've never seen but if you've seen it before, try to watch it with new eyes.
2. Draw while you watch the movie, looking for recurring themes, symbols, motifs, or interesting characters that move the story along.
3. Make notes and doodles of things that grab your attention in the film that you can refer to later in case you want to make more finished drawings inspired by the movie.



### SOME THINGS TO CONSIDER

- *Look for how the filmmaker uses the elements of design to tell their story. What kinds of things are important to it? Maybe it's a color (palette), sound, landscape, etc.*
- *Don't try to make your drawings perfect, just get your ideas down and keep your mind open to things that inspire you about the film.*
- *What fresh insight can your art bring to the story? Sometimes an entire story can shift based on an altered point of emphasis...*

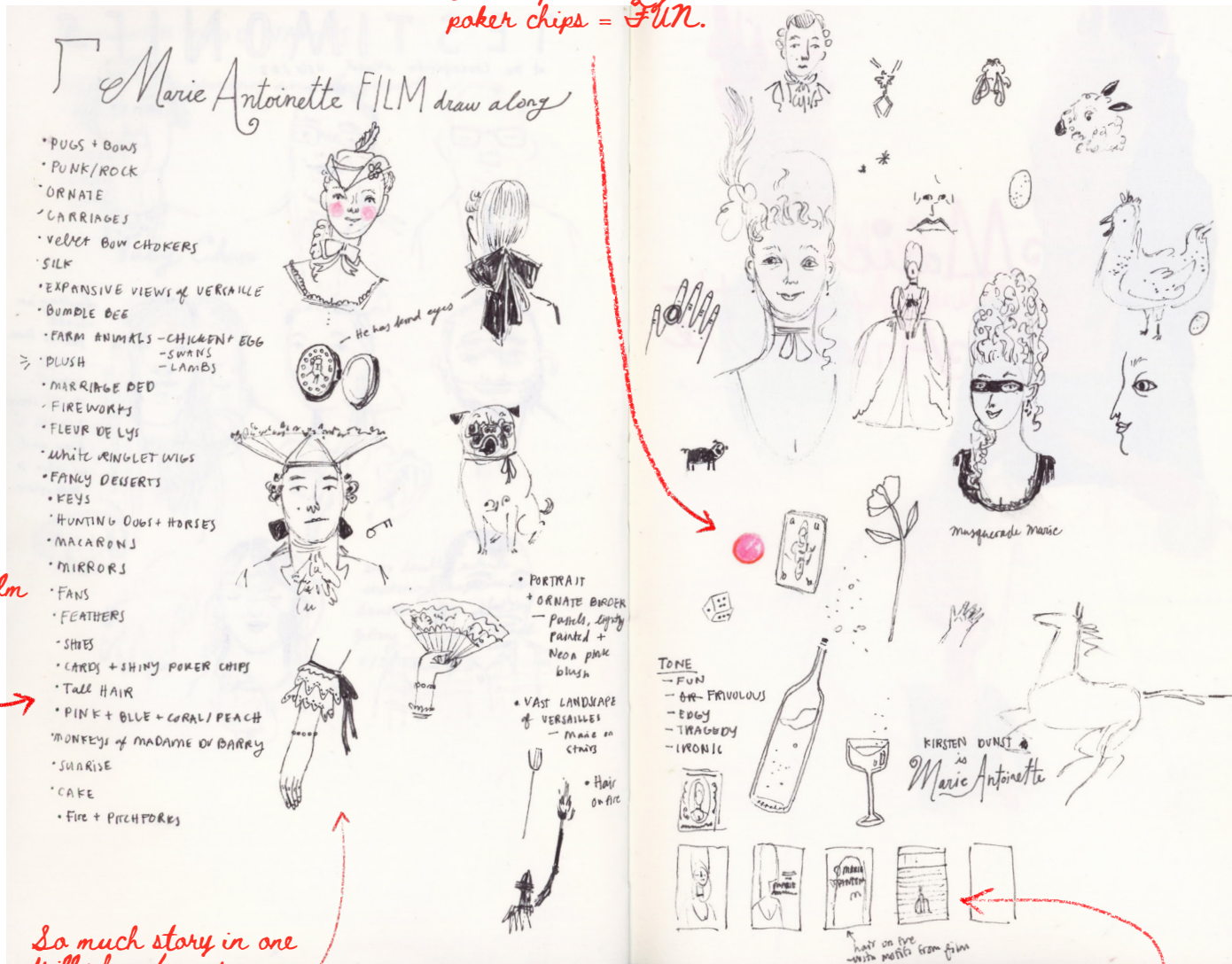
#### \*Success Path Stage Application

- 4 Open your mind to other's creative work as a source of inspiration.
- 5 How can you turn your doodles and ideas into a finished piece?
